#### He pouri nui tenei

Firstly, Peri and Deena attended Koro Bill Dinsdale's tangihanga. His funeral was on Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> August where he was lying at Makahae marae followed by interment at Kenana urupa next to his wife Alice. He was 94yrs and has two remaining sisters (Nanny's Ngatau and Margaret).

#### Generally

The committee had a catch up and what's been happening within our immediate families since our last meeting on 15<sup>th</sup> July 07. Our scheduled August meeting was postponed to this date (2 Sept 07), due to family commitments.

#### Trip to Rotorua - MARAE – Peri

At our last meeting on 15th July 2007:

• The committee plan to go to Rotorua (at their own expense), and check out the marae and areas of interest for the reunion.

Cheap flights became available 20 July and Peri & Karen were able to go and check this out.

Tutanekai marae is suitable for x100 capacity for sleeping and hosting over the 3 day reunion. At this stage we are half full with registrations. We have had no whanau from overseas express an interest at this stage and Deena will keep working on her database to email, post to those whanau she has on her listing.

#### Whare kai:

- 1 conventional stove
- 1 commercial gas stove
- 1 brand new turbo fan oven
- 1 brand new large gas operated multikai cooker
- Cooking and servery utensils
- 1 chiller
- Several chiller fridges for drinks
- Tables and seating for x100 people

What we may need to consider besides kai:

- Tea towels
- Cleaning sundries
- Kitchen roster
- Trg on some equipment (if we don't have whanau who already know how to use large equipment)
- First aid kit

#### Whare tipuna has capacity for x100 people:

- Mattresses and pillows
- Kaumatua compartment
- Vacuum cleaner
- Air conditioner

What we may need to consider:

- Whanau to bring their own linen
- Space
- Storage of valuables

#### Whare paku:

 Showers and toilet blocks have been renovated and each block has about 4 showers and toilets

What we may need to consider:

- There is limited hot water
- Cleaning and sundries replenishment roster
- Adequate rubbish bins

#### Grounds:

- Designated smoking area is behind the whare kai this will be clearly indicated to all whanau on arrival
- No alcohol or drugs on the grounds or within the premises of the marae. A
  pub is located up the road from the marae and this will be operating up till
  Christmas eve.
- No tents are allowed to be pitched on the marae grounds
- Access to the lake is via private property however the committee would like
  to discourage swimming in the lake at this time and will consider options for
  our children and are taking the 'better to be safe than sorry' approach
- Keeping the grounds clean and tidy as well as the noise level to a reasonable level at all times is paramount as there are lots of whanau living close and directly around their marae. Some children/visitors may show up at the marae, (as it is Christmas time) and all children/visitors to be treated hospitably or referred to Peri if there are inquiries. This is also a good reason to ensure any valuables/wallets are not left unattended or are locked away in vehicles for safekeeping as the committee takes no responsibility for any missing items.

## Powhiri on Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> December 2007 around 5pm

- All our elders and all whanau, especially any whanau who have NOT been on Tutanekai marae before, are encouraged to attend this powhiri to be welcomed on for the first time in respect to kawa and tikanga
- Following powhiri and the marae been handed over there will be a kai
  and a quiet, relaxing evening to settle in before the First Day of the Reunion.
- That night hopefully one of Peri's uncles may be available to come up and give a korero about the marae and the Ngati Te Roro o Te Rangi hapü.

The committee and those whanau who are helping out - can start setting up the whare kai re: kai preparation, set up on Sunday morning and will have access to the whare nui after the powhiri.

## The actual Reunion will be 3 Days in duration

Monday 24th December – Day One: Whanaungatanga/Whakapapa

Tuesday 25<sup>th</sup> December – Day Two: Christmas Day Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> December – Day Three: Pilgrimage

#### Before and after

Whanau can arrive and stay the night of Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> December Whanau must vacate no later than 12noon Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> December 2007 (there may be a group coming in at that time). The marae and grounds must be left in clean and tidy condition before 12noon.

## Trip to Rotorua - BUS TRIP – Peri

Route: (tentative). Te Puke, (urupa visit), The Cut, Maketu, Little Waihi, Rotoiti

(urupa visit), Rotorua city, return to marae

Return: 3.30pm

- A cut lunch will be prepared and taken on the bus for everyone. We hope to initiate a sports game either at Maketu or Lake Rotoiti - where ever lunch till take place.
- Harakeke flowers to be prepared by our wahine whanau the night before, to be placed at each of our urupa.
- If there are too many whanau private vehicles will be required to use as well. Please be prepared for this if we have a big turnout, otherwise – filling the bus is priority.

- If adventurous whanau would like to go fishing or kai gathering, we hope to have a timetable that our bus will be at each place – to meet up and join in the convoy throughout our district and home.
- Bus stops will take place throughout the trip ie: toilet stops.
